Take a **STAND AGAINST BULLYING!**

Throughout the year our administration, teachers and staff are committed to preventing and providing interventions against bullying. Earlier this year I sent home a letter explaining the ways here at Lake Forest East we help students identify bullying and ways to handle such situations. Unfortunately, bullying has become more prevalent and more intense within our society. It can be very destructive to the well-being of students, creates unsafe schools and can hinder academics. These are the many reasons why it is important to be proactive! Throughout the year guidance lessons are taught to help students develop empathy toward others, ways to use self-control, and coping strategies to deal with a bully. Students also learn what it means to be the innocent bystander and the correct ways to help the victim by "Taking a Stand Against Bullying."

Characteristics of a "BULLY"

Repeated = bully targets same victim over and over again

Deliberate = the intention is to hurt someone

Power Play = bully chooses a victim he/she perceives as vulnerable
